We are so happy to see friendly little faces excited to be arriving at school each day, but we remind you that TheirCare operates Before School Care from 6:30am - 8:45am each day for students who need to arrive at school before 8:45 am. Although school staff are frequently onsite before <u>8:45 am</u>, they are involved in meetings and planning during this time and as such are not rostered to supervise students.

If your child needs to be dropped off before 8:45 am in a one off situation, supervision can be arranged by prior agreement with the school staff. Students who regularly arrive at school before 8:45 am, need to be booked into Before School Care with TheirCare.

Protecting children & young people from abuse is our responsibility

The Child Safe Standards are compulsory minimum standards for all Victorian schools to ensure they are well prepared to keep children and young people safe and protect them from abuse. The Child Safe Standards include requirements to keep children, young people and students safe. There are eleven Child Safe Standards. Each newsletter we will introduce a one standard keeping you

informed of our work supporting and implementing the standards.

#### Child Safe Standard 3 - Children are safe, informed and actively participate

At Mooroopna North PS our work within this standard includes;

Our Child Safety and Wellbeing Policy ensures that children and students are supported and empowered. The Complaints Policy allows students to raise concerns and is widely promoted to parents and students. The Student Wellbeing and Engagement Policy prioritizes student wellbeing. Students receive sexual abuse prevention programs and relevant information through various sources. The School-wide Positive Behaviour Support Framework educates students about their rights. Friendship and peer support are encouraged through social skills target groups and allied health placement students.

### Child safety and wellbeing at Mooroopna North Primary School information for families and the school community

The Victorian Government has announced new <u>Child Safe Standards</u> to further strengthen child safety across organisations, including schools. The new standards recognise the critical importance of families and the broader school community in maintaining and promoting child safety and wellbeing.

Mooroopna North Primary School has reviewed and updated our child safety policies and procedures to ensure they meet the requirements of the new standards. These are available to view on the school's website.
